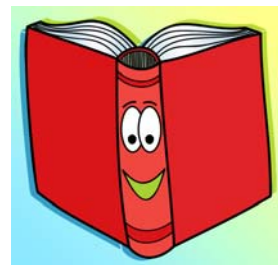

FAIR TRADE

The belief in Fair Trade and equal living keeps shining in the Lion's Den. McKay's great staff, student body and Fair Trade committee continues to sell Fair Trade bananas, chocolate, and banana muffins. Our school is spreading the word about Fair Trade and the great things it does for people around the world.



On November 22nd, McKay partnered up with the Fair Trade Town Committee of Port Colborne to hold a documentary night at Port High. It focused on the *True Cost* of fast fashion. Popcorn and Fair Trade chocolate was sold. The night was engaging and an eventful evening for those who attended.

Gearing up for the holidays, McKay hosted a Holiday Bazaar on Saturday, November 25th with many local vendors, including Casa Relief, a retailer of Fair Trade fashion and accessories based out of Beamsville.

On November 28th, our school was fortunate to have Ryan Hreljac give a presentation about his foundation, "Ryan's Well". Mr. Hreljac explained how the foundation helps people around the world get a clean drinkable water supply. It was a fantastic, eye-opening speech that the entire school enjoyed. To contribute to "Ryan's Well", McKay is taking part in this year's School Challenge to raise funds to provide much needed resources and access to clean water for a community in Kenya. McKay and Ryan share a global equality mindset, and we're excited to be a part of this year's challenge!

On Saturday, December 2nd, McKay Public School took part in the Port Colborne Annual Santa Claus Parade. Walking with the the Fair Trade Town Committee, we distributed samples of Fair Trade chocolate. Fair Trade hot chocolate was also served during Santa's visit at the Guild Hall in the afternoon, as well as after the parade.

Throughout the week of December 11th, we will be hosting a sale of Fair Trade items from Ten Thousand Villages during first break outside the office. Prices will range from \$5-\$30. Be sure to check it out, and get something special for someone while supporting producers in developing countries!

Fitness and Nutrition Breaks

The second Nutrition Break is considered the lunch break and students are welcome to stay for lunch provided that they follow our simple rules:

- Remain in your seat, no walking around during the eating portion of the break;
- No loud talking, be respectful of your neighbours;
- Clean up after yourself, dispose of garbage and make sure that your desk is clean;
- You must have written permission from your parent/guardian to leave the school property.

Students that leave school property are expected to return on time (1:30pm). Failure to be responsible for their timely return, may result in students losing this privilege, temporarily or permanently, depending on the severity of the problem.

Student pick-up and drop-off

Regardless of whether students are late or leaving early, we ask that all students check in at the office. This enables the office staff to ensure that all students are arriving safely to class or being dismissed to the appropriate person.

Furthermore, we would like to request that parents/adults wait at the office at all times. If your child requires assistance getting to class, one of the office staff would be happy to escort them. Any information you would like to convey to teachers can also be conveyed by the office or through your child's agenda.

Once classes have started we want to minimize the disruption to other students that are participating in the instructional day.
